It can produce numerous fruits, dispersed by birds and animals, and it can sucker to create dense stands. Notes on Taxonomy and Nomenclature Top of page. *Fallopia japonica* was independently classified as *Reynoutria japonica* by Houttuyn in 1777 and as *Polygonum cuspidatum* by Siebold in 1846. It was not until the early part of the twentieth century that these were discovered to be the same plant (Bailey, 1990), which is generally referred to as *Polygonum cuspidatum* by Japanese and American authors ...Simplified Turfgrass Disease Identification Key A. Distinct patches of yellow to brown colored grass are present. Patch is small, circular, sunken, and rarely exceed 3 inches in diameter. The tomato is the edible, often red, berry of the nightshade *Solanum lycopersicum*, commonly known as a tomato plant. The species originated in western South America. The Nahuatl (Aztec language) word *tomatl* gave rise to the Spanish word *tomate*, from which the English word *tomato* derived.
