This biography of Malcolm Muggeridge traces the varied life of one of the most brilliant and controversial men of the twentieth century. The author, Ian Hunter, was given full access to all of Muggeridge's unpublished material, letters, and diaries. Malcolm Muggeridge. As a young man, Muggeridge was a left-wing sympathiser but he later became a forceful anti-communist. During World War II he worked for the British government as a soldier and a spy. He helped bring Mother Teresa to popular attention in the West. In his later years he was outspoken on religious and moral issues. Muggeridge (1903 –1990) was born into a Fabian socialist family in England. During his long and intriguing life, he was a journalist, author, media personality, satirist, and for some years the editor of Punch magazine, the British equivalent of The New Yorker .Malcolm Muggeridge A Life.
